11.Significant contributions made by IQAC during the current year (maximum five bullets)

1. Precautionary measures during Covid-19 period:- The session 2020-21, unfortunately was affected badly by Covid-19 pandemic. During this period, our college Management, Principal and staff did each and every effort for safety during Covid-19 period. Regular guidelines issued by Government were strictly followed in the college. No entry without mask, use of sanitizers, social distancing, thermal screening at entry gate etc. are regular features which are being strictly followed till date. Apart from it, sample testing camps, vaccination camps, Awareness Rallies, Door to Door Awareness campaigns etc. were commendable efforts by college staff and students during this year.

2. Management of Staff & Students Interaction processes during Covid-19 period:- For proper and uninterrupted classes during this period, Google classroom, Zoom meetings, videos on you-tube, Messages on college website, Facebook, Whatsapp groups etc. were appreciable efforts done by college staff. Online classes were regularly conducted during lockdown period to continue studies. Lots of departments organized webinars and extension lectures on different current social issues to manage stress during covid-19 period and different aspects related to health and hygiene. Lots of co-curricular activities and competitions were organized online by various departments for which online prizes and E-Certificates were given to the winners. 15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary	
Our Institution has interdisciplinary approach which allows for the combination of different subjects in one course that helps in gaining knowledge and also encourages the students to apply their existing and newly acquired knowledge in more practical and hand-on way.	

The interdisciplinary approach allows students to share knowledge of different disciplines enhancing the scope and depth of learning. Interdisciplinary learning isn't just an educational philosophy it's a tangible way of understanding the world.

This approach facilitates the students to choose any subject according to their interest.

Our institution provides regular degree programs in Arts, Science, Commerce at UG level and also post graduation programs in Economics, English and Mathematics.

Several courses are run by this institution viz; B.A, B.Sc N.M (Aided), B.Sc Med (Aided), B.Sc comp.sci, B.Sc Med(SFS), B.Sc Non Med(SFS), M.A Eco, M.A English, M.Sc Math, B.C.A, B.Com (Aided), B.Com (SFS), B.Com Voc, B.Com computer application .About 3,000 students have been enrolled in several courses this year.

University schemes of examination for various courses have also been revised with a view to give students multi subjects option in various courses viz- Hobby club at UG and PG level and open elective paper with variety of options.

Thus our college is functioning with the aim to achieve the goal of new education policy by various types of courses for skill development.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Academic Bank of Credit is a very beneficial way of checking students performance record in one click. The objectives of ABC are to keep digital record of students progress alongwith options to choose courses etc. as per their own field of interest. This is not completely implemented in our college but its objectives are somewhat achieved by adopting Choice Based Credit System in various UG and PG Courses. This system provides options to choose subjects of their own interest. Along with it there are open elective papers also where students can choose subject of other discipline also. So the objective of choice and multi disciplinary courses is being fulfilled in UG and PG courses, Apart from open elective paper, CBLU has also included compulsory subject of Hobby club in UG and PG courses in this CBCS scheme. In Hobby club also students get option to choose hobby as per their interest. Credits are fixed in the scheme of examination for all the subjects.

17.Skill development:

The traditional education system has trained students to assess themselves in terms of marks and grades. However, introducing skill based learning at an early age prepares children for the real world beyond test scores. Most of the students, even after completing their education, remain clueless about what career path to choose. This is because they never got a chance to identify their true passion and talent. Skill development during education will help students to figure out their strength and weakness.

The college is running regular undergraduate courses in Arts, Science, Commerce and Computer applications and post graduate courses in Economics, English and Mathematics and also vocational courses in Advertising and sales management. Scheme of examinations of many courses have been revised by University authorities to offer students multidisciplinary subjects so as to develop their skills as per their interests. With this objective of skill development of girls during their studies, our staff organises various workshops, training programmes, skill based programmes and also different competitions etc. Various committees/cells are there in this college subject societies, legal literacy cell, Red Ribbon club, Women cell, IQAC, NSS etc.

All these cells and departments organise various activities such as talent show, Quiz, PPT, Poster making competition, Basketball, Yoga, Essay writing, Poetic recitation, Rangoli, Best out of waste, Painting, pot making, singing, Dancing, Acting, sports activities etc.

The efforts of teachers and students result in development of co-curricular skills among students. The number of prizes won by our students at different levels in variety of activities are proof of all our efforts towards skill development. Education system has trained students to assess themselves in terms of marks and grades. However, introducing skill based learning at an early age prepares children for the real world beyond test scores. Most of the students, even after completing their education, remain clueless about what career path to choose. This is because they never got a chance to identify their true passion and talent. Skill development during education will help students to figure out their strength and weakness.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language,

culture, using online course)

India's Knowledge tradition is ancient and uninterrupted like the flow of River Ganga, from the Vedas (upanishads) to Sri Aurobindo, Knowledge has been at the centre of all rational and speculative inquiry in India.

Basically, Traditional Knowledge is the awareness, experience, expertise, knowledge and applications that are established, continued performed and passed on generation to generation within a region or community. But Modern education system is somewhat different from the traditional education as per demand of changing environment. Modern education teaches about the practical knowledge with practical training so as to achieve the target of skill development as mentioned in NEP 2020.

Today teaching has become more student centric. Our college is running various UG and PG courses in Science, Commerce, Arts and Computer Science. The scheme of exam applied here is being given by Chaudhary Bansi Lal university, Bhiwani. Our Faculty members use Hindi as well as English languages while teaching because students have option to choose medium of language in most of the subjects except Hindi, English and Sanskrit. Today most of the schemes of examinations have been revised with a view to include practicals, hobby clubs, open elective subjects with a variety of optional multi disciplinary subjects. Also Choice Based Credit System is being implemented in UG as well as PG courses to attain the objectives set in NEP 2020. All these changes are aimed towards integration of Indian knowledge system with practical skill development so as to prepare students for today's world of innovation.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Our curriculum focuses on Outcomes Based Education (OBE). There is a proper mechanism for analyzing the outcomes of different programs and courses that is decided by collective consent of the IQAC members in the beginning of the session. They instruct the HODs to prepare a list of outcomes of their respective courses. Then the concerned teachers extract the outcomes of their respective subjects. Later on, further activities are planned according to the extracted outcomes. There is no single specified style of teaching or assessment in OBE; instead, classes, opportunities, assessments should all help students achieve the specified outcomes. The role of the faculty adapts into instructor, trainer, facilitator, and/or mentor based on the outcomes targeted. In order to achieve the extracted outcomes

teachers does a lot at their end which includes preparation of lesson plans, sharing the lesson plans with the students, conduction of various extra-curricular activities like group discussions, debates, presentations etc., and following the proper mechanism for internal assessment.

20.Distance education/online education:

Since the Covid-19 Pandemic in 2020 has disrupted the normal life style of people, across the globe, the virtual world has come to rescue. Like most of the institutions, our college also shifted to online classes from April 2020. Our faculty members delivered lectures online on google meet, zoom, classroom apps etc. and shared study materials and audio files with students over the internet (whatsapp). Apart from it college organized live webinars and workshops. Also videos were uploaded on you-tube for students. So the academic activities were not affected. The faculty members were available online during interactive session for students to clear their doubts.

Some teachers might also had struggles to adopt to online teaching due to lack of adequate digital skills and for this college organized online workshop in which faculty members were trained by Spikeage IT company. In this workshop faculty members were trained for conducting online classes, How to use classroom app, Googlemeet etc.

As a result, the faculty members were trained for offering online lessons using different digital platforms. Depending on the nature of the courses and students internet access, a cloud based Learning management system offered by Google was implemented and supported by Spikeage IT Company. They provided 266 classrooms with 4136 users to facilitate online classes.

Through online teaching the teaching and learning process became possible from home. However Online education cannot replace the physical Classroom. It was supplement. But was beneficial to continue the teaching Process during Covid-19 as physical classes were not possible at that time.
