NEP Committee

<u>Aim</u>: Making the education more equitable, holistic and inclusive as per changing needs of the society.

Objectives:

- i. To encourage multilingual and interdisciplinary education
- ii. To promote a flexible curriculum for nurturing diverse skills
 - iii To encourage research and development in education
- iv. To promote discussion based teaching, learner centric teaching, value based education and the discovery oriented teaching
- v. To shape the learners as critical thinkers and as the multidisciplinary thinkers.

Key highlights of the policy in Higher education

<u>Academic Bank of credit (ABC):</u> is to be established. It would digitally store the academic credits earned from various recognized higher education institutes (HEIS). On the basis of which HEI would award the degrees taking into account the credits earned.

(MERUS): (Multidisciplinary Education and Research Universities) at par with IITs, IIMs etc. would be set up, aiming to attain the highest global standards in the quality education.

<u>Holistic and Multidisciplinary Education:</u> The policy is introducing a multidisciplinary, broad based and the holistic undergraduate education which involves creative combinations of subjects, multiple entry, multiple exit points, flexible curriculum, integration of vocational education and the appropriate certification.

The U. G degree would be of either three or four years and the duration containing multiple exit points and appropriate certifications. After Completing one year in any discipline or any field including vocational and the professional areas, certificate will be awarded. Diploma will be awarded after two years of study, a bachelor's degree after three years programme.

 $.\underline{NTA}$: The national testing agency or NTA will conduct a common college entrance examtwice a year.

<u>NRF</u>: To enable the culture of research to permeate through our universities , NRF or national research foundation will be established like an apex body.

(NETF): New policy recommends to create an autonomous body, the National Education Technology Forum for providing a platform, of free exchange of ideas regarding use of technology for enhancing the learning, assessment and planning administration.

Online and Digital Education: In MHRD, one unit will be created to build the digital Content, capacity building and the digital infrastructure, which would look after the needs of e-education of schools as well as the higher education.

<u>Open and Distance learning:</u> For increasing (GER), the Gross Enrolment Ratio, in higher education the provision of open and distance leaning will be given . some measures like funding for research, online courses , digital repositories, improved student services, MOOC's credit based recognition etc. would

be taken for ensuring the same at par with the quality education in-class programmes.

Internationalisation: The New policy promotes to establish an International students office at each HEI, hosting foreign students for coordinating various matters like supporting the abroad students, research or teaching collaboration dealings, exchange of faculty/students and signing the mutual beneficial MOU's with high quality foreign Institutes.

<u>National Scholarship Portal:</u> will be expended for supporting, fostering and tracking the students receiving scholarships. Private HEIs would be encouraged for a number of freeships and scholarships to their students.

<u>Autonomous Colleges and Universities:</u> The policy is suggesting a system of graded autonomy and the graded accreditation in a manner of phases, over a period of fifteen years. In India all HEI's will aim to become self - governing institutions for excellence and innovations. It is assumed that every HEI will turn into an autonomous degree granting HEI or a constituent HEI of any university, over a period of time.

<u>MOOC's</u>: The massive open online courses, a platform allowing students to learn at their own pace for career development, changing carrier ,supplementary learning ,corporate e learning and training etc. The new policy promotes MOOCs for earning credits. The world's largest online free E-learning platform portal is "SWAYAM" in India. Additionally NPTEL, MOOKIT, IITBX are also popular platforms for open online learning.
